Minority versus diaspora

APPADURAI (1995):

appreciation of diasporas

KYMLICKA (1995):

- national minorities vs ethnic groups
- autochthony vs. migrational origin

KEMÉNYFI (2006):

- autochthon (aboriginal, native) vs.
- allochthon (immigrant, diaspora)

The definition of autochthonous minorities

Differentiation of minorities based on Hungarian examples:

ethnical minorities: Gypsies

national minorities: Croats

minorities based on linguistic

differences: Swabian (German) people

religious minorities
 Jewish communities

+1 based on geographic concentration: block or bulk vs. sporadic minority

The criterias of diaspora communities

Minority communities living far away from their home country:


- (1) **dispersed** from one original centre into at least two peripheral places,
- (2) **preserve** the memory, vision or myth of their original native country,
- (3) think that they are not accepted entirely in the host country,
- (4) consider their **homeland** (kin state) as a place of re-entry,
- (5) feel **commitment** to the survival or reconstruction of their native country,
- (6) and the continuous **connection** with their homeland defines the consciousness and cohesion of the immigrant minority significantly.





PTE DIASPORA PROJECT NETWORK Founding Charta

The University of Pécs (referred to as: PTE) is celebrating its 650th anniversary whit the help of the Pécs dioceses and the city of Pécs. The program is supported by the Hungarian Government in the 2029/2015. (XII.29.) decision. Furthermore, from the 1st of September 2017, September the first will be the day of Hungarian Education in memorial of the foundation of our university by the Parliament in 6/2016. (IV.5.) decision.

The first event will be on the 1th of April, 2017 in the context of PTE 650 Jubilee program called Hungarians II. Cultural World conference.
